Activities	Writing – Create a text – talking about feelings.
	Choice - different levels of challenge for pupils – Use the activities that will be suitable for you.
	*Diary— Moving to Glasgow at Seventeen. One or two paragraphs from Jessie's persepective. How was she feeling - leaving home? What were the main things that happened? Remember this is Jessie writing her diary.
	**I wonder what it would be like if Jessie had Facebook or Instagram? Create a profile page for Jessie starting with posts on her timeline/feed as a teenager, then moving to Glasgow, singing and getting married.
	*** Write the beginning of Jessie's autobiography. Put yourself in her shoes. How would you start?
	Think about: -When she started singing -Moving to Glasgow -Learning Opera Singing -Meeting Robert -Getting married
	To provide extra challenge to Gaelic learners, depending on their level of Gaelic and understanding, all three activities could be produced in English, Gaelic or Bilingually.
